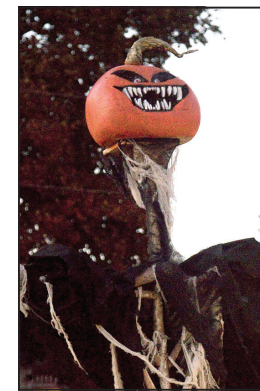
Halloween garden and drive-thru a spooktacular success
